Dear Friend of Beaver Creek Schools,

In January of this year, the Beaver Creek City School District entered into a ten year agreement with Miami Valley Hospital. Our school district agreed to rename the athletic stadium "Frank Zink Field at Miami Valley Hospital" and we agreed to use the training services of Miami Valley Hospital professionals. In exchange, the district was promised \$1.3 million dollars over the next ten years. We promised to make improvements to the stadium as soon as was reasonably possible.

The School Board and Director of Business Services have been busy approving agreements to make these improvements happen prior to the fall season. The money we have been guaranteed will allow us to install a new synthetic playing surface at no expense to the taxpayers of Beaver Creek. The synthetic surface will be the same surface that has been installed at The Ohio State University Stadium. It will be green in color and will have a Block B on the 50 yard line facing the home bleachers. There is a desire to have writing in the end zone ("Beaver Creek" in one end zone and "Beavers" in the other) and to have the end zone colored in orange. The cost to do both of these improvements is \$45,000. The Board of Education has made the promise that any improvements made to the stadium will be made at no expense to taxpayers. Since the MVH dollars have already been committed, the only way that the end zone lettering and coloring can occur is if private funds can be raised to pay for it. Any individual or business willing to donate at least \$1000 toward that \$45,000 needed will have their name printed on a plaque at the stadium. Any individual who donates at least \$100 will have his/her name in the athletic program. If the amount needed in private funding cannot be generated, contributions will be returned, and the end zones will remain green and there will not be any lettering.
